

## MERAKI GO CASE STUDY TERMS

### 1. The Promoter

Westcon Group European Operations Limited, a company registered in England and Wales under company number 04411285, with its registered office at Chandler's House, Wilkinson Way, Love Lane Industrial Estate, GL7 1YT, United Kingdom ("Promoter").

### 2. How to enter

- 2.1 You must be a registered Westcon Reseller and must be nominated by your local Westcon sales team.
- 2.2 By nominating a customer to participate, Reseller agrees to be bound by these terms and conditions and undertakes to pass on the Meraki Go kit to the nominated customer.
- 2.3 Reseller agrees and undertakes to procure that the nominated end customer will commit to providing Comstor with a case study after a 3-month period of use of the kit, in the form stipulated by Comstor.
- 2.4 No purchase is necessary

### 3. Eligibility

- 3.1 The case study opportunity is only open to Comstor registered partners in the UK; Germany; France; Spain; Portugal; Benelux; Finland; Sweden; Norway; Denmark; Baltics, **except:**
  - (a) employees of the Promoter or its holding or subsidiary companies.
  - (b) employees of agents or suppliers of the Promoter or its holding or subsidiary companies, who are professionally connected with the competition or its administration;  
or
  - (c) members of the immediate families or households of (a) and (b) above.
- 3.2 There is a limit of three case study opportunities per country and Comstor will identify eligible partners to participate.

### 4. Case Studies

- 4.1 Comstor will contact the partner at the end of the 3-month trial period to obtain the case study details.
- 4.2 Reseller is responsible for procuring all consents rights and licences for use of its customers' case study in accordance with these terms.

- 4.3 The Promoter will publish the company name and details of the case study on social media outlets, online and in its marketing materials
- 4.4 If you or nominated customer object to any or all of your company name and case study details being published, you must not nominate or take part in this case study. In such circumstances, the Promoter will not dispatch the Meraki Go kit.

## **5. Limitation of liability**

Insofar as is permitted by law, the Promoter, its agents or distributors will not in any circumstances be responsible or liable to compensate the winner or accept any liability for any loss, damage, personal injury or death occurring as a result of taking up the prize except where it is caused by the negligence of the Promoter, its agents or distributors or that of their employees. Your statutory rights are not affected.
